Henry Robert Rauber passed away on Thursday, August 19, 2010 at the age of 94. Beloved husband of 72 years to Mae Kahl Rauber. Father of Darryl, Ronald and Gary Rauber. Son of the late Wilhelmina and Henry Rauber. Brother of the late Frank, Marie, Adele, Elvira and John. Grandfather of five, one deceased. Also survived by four great-grandchildren and one great great-grandchild. He was a native of New Orleans where he was Deputy Director of Administration for the Port of New Orleans and retired after 50 years of service, retired as a Lt. Colonel for the Army Reserve and was a resident of Covington for the past 25 years. Mr. Rauber was the first elected employee member of the Louisiana Civil Service Commission and was a recipient of the Charles E. Dunbar, Jr. Career Service Award. He was past president of the 377th Transportation Terminal Command Chapter Reserve Officers Assoc. and a longtime member and past chairman of the Delta Safety Society. He was past president of the Louisiana Chapter of the American Society for Training and Development, Veterans of Safety and the Louisiana Chapter of the International Personnel Management Assoc. He was also a board member of numerous other personnel and safety organizations.
