**M**r. Bertil Emile Danielson, 64, passed away on Friday, May 2, 2014. He was born and raised in New Orleans and later a resident of Mandeville and Fairhope, Alabama.

He was the son of Mary Elise Naef Danielson and the late C. Bertil Danielson. Bertil is survived by his daughters Susan Naef Danielson and Amalie Kammer Danielson of Mandeville and his sisters, Memise Danielson Burslem of Folsom, Louisiana and Lou Ella Danielson Stewart of Asheville, North Carolina.

Bertil was a member of the First Church of Christ, Scientist in Fairhope, Alabama and a U.S. Army veteran of Vietnam. He had been an active member of several New Orleans Carnival organizations as well as the Southern Yacht Club of New Orleans.
