She was a dedicated and beloved teacher having taught Spanish Language Arts and American History at St. Peter's Catholic School in Covington, LA. While at St. Peter's, she founded the school newspaper "The Pebble" and school yearbook "The Road Runner." She also founded the first Junior Chapter of the National Honor Society at St. Peter's. She touched the lives of many children and their families. Her influence can be seen in the numerous educators who credit her as being the inspiration to choose teaching as their profession. She was a member of the Knights of Columbus Kaycettes Ladies Auxiliary. She served as a maid for the Royal Krewe of Kaa Cee. She enjoyed reading, gardening and sewing, making many a beautiful dress for her five daughters. She loved the color yellow. She loved puns and her quick wit made her a scrabble champ and spades card shark. She loved music and dancing with her beloved Carlos.

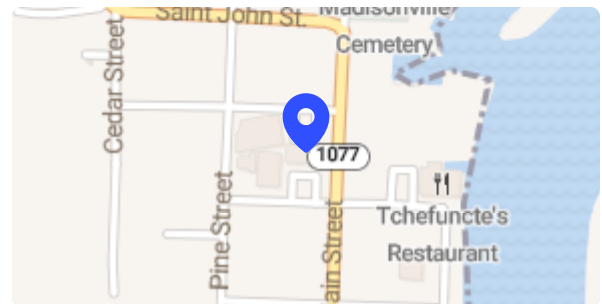
