John Bruce Brannon, age 85, died on Wednesday, November 21, 2018, at his residence in Lacombe, LA. Born Sunday, February 19, 1933 in Greenville, SC to Burton Earl and Evelyn Louise Rodgers Brannon.

Bruce spent most of his career as a sales manager with GTE- Sylvania lighting. Upon his retirement he served twenty-two years as Captain and Safety Officer for St. Tammany Fire District 3 where he was recently awarded a lifetime honorary membership. Bruce was a longtime member of the St. Timothy United Methodist Church Choir where he was known for his bass voice and sense of humor.
