With COVID-19, restrictions social distancing and face mask are required to attend services.



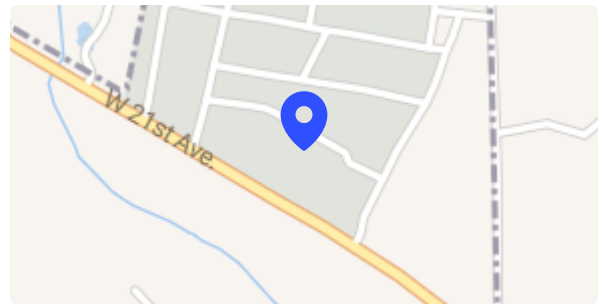

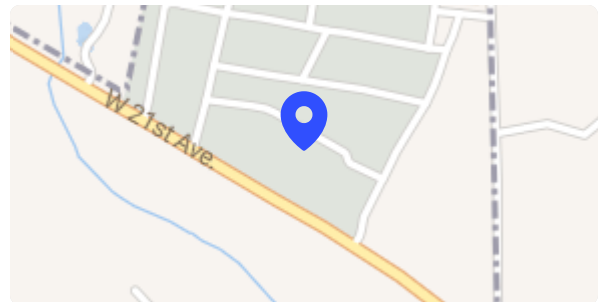

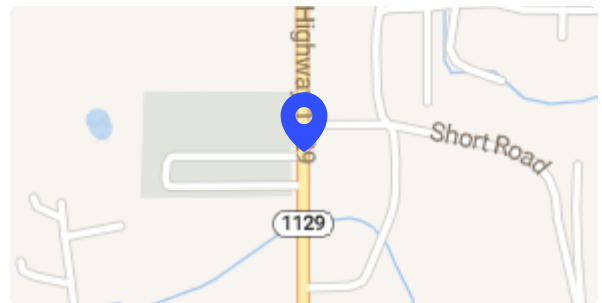
