Patricia Carolyn Jenkins, age 97, passed away peacefully surrounded by loving family and her dog, Daisy on May 31, 2022 in Covington, Louisiana.

She was born in Evansville, Indiana on January 23, 1925 to the late John Logan Key and Mary Matilda Willet.

Pat lived for over 35 years in Leesburg and Mt. Dora, most recently at The Oaks at Waterman Village.

In 2021 she made the decision to move to Louisiana to live with her son.

Pat embraced life.

She was a graduate of the Protestant Deaconess Hospital School of Nursing, Evansville, Indiana and retired from Missouri Baptist Hospital in St. Louis, Missouri.
