Rudolph Maurice Green Sr., at the age of 100, entered eternal rest peacefully on Thursday afternoon, January 4, 2024, at Ochsner Louisiana State University Health Center in Shreveport, surrounded by his adoring loving family. He was born in Pearlington, Mississippi on June 30, 1923, to Gus Green and Rena Jackson Green.

He is survived by his adoring children Maurice Green, Jo Ann Green-Silvie (Robert Silvie, Sr.), Anthony Green (Jaliene Green) and Rudolph Green Jr. Rudolph was the proud grandfather of Michelle Muse, Janet Silvie-Milner, Robert Silvie, II., Joi Silvie, Jane Silvie, Jasmine Green, and Jonathan Green, and great grandfather of Quantrell Muse, Makiya Muse, Terrence Johnson Jr., Jayson Henry, Madison Milner, and Juniper Black. Rudolph will be missed greatly by a host of nieces, nephews, cousins, and wonderful lifelong friends.

Rudolph was preceded in death by his wife of 67 years, Josephine Leonard Green. He was the last remaining sibling of his brothers Dave Dawson, Sumner Winston, Milton Winston, Tommy Winston, and George Winston.

Rudolph was a longtime resident of Mandeville, serving faithfully at Goodwill Missionary Baptist Church as a Deacon. He would spend his later years as a resident of Shreveport where he was a member under watch care at the Mount Canaan Baptist Church as an honorary Deacon. His faith was very important to him, and he was joyful in his prayer and worship.

On January 31, 1952, Rudolph proudly joined the United States Air Force, after having been honorable discharged from the United States Army after four years of service. In the United States Air Force, he received his orders to defend the United States of America in World War II. His dedication to his country continued after World War II. He proudly fulfilled his order to serve in the Korean War utilizing his knowledge and experience as an Airplane Mechanic. Later, his commitment to live up to the United States Air Force Motto: "Aim High" would be called on once again, and he bravely served in the Vietnam War. Service Medal, having broken barriers fighting with the enemies in three wars. On March 19, 1971, Technical Sergeant Rudolph M. Green retired from the United States Air Force.
