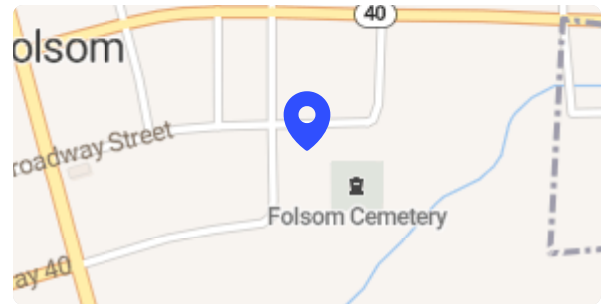

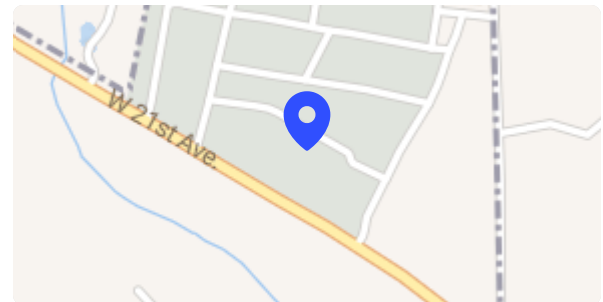

She was one of the reasons I hated leaving the Folsom area but I felt being told it was time to do so while I could still leave of my own power an be closer to some family assistance if needed.
