He disappeared for a while once and when I saw him again he said he'd broken his hip and had been in the hospital. "They won't let me drive anymore!" he exclaimed with indignation. I asked him how he had gotten to town. "I rode my bike" he said. This was a man who enjoyed his life. Yes, he frequented bars, and yes, at times he was a bit too much but he will be greatly missed.
