I don't remember how she and the teacher got me to stay for the first day. She did tell me it happened again about 2 more times before I stayed in my desk for good.

We shared a lot of life. I will be continuing our journey everytime I pray and we will celebrate again when I leave, united with all our loves who are and will be with God.
